NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGE TO REGULATIONS
Commercial Passenger Vehicle Regulation 20 CBJAC 40

Purpose:

As currently adopted, the Commercial Passenger Vehicle (CPV) Regulations only have requirements for Class A and B vehicles. This regulation change would provide appropriate insurance requirements for all classes of CPVs. An additional change would reduce the inspection fee for Class C vehicles.

Existing Regulation with Proposed Change:

20 CBJAC 40.120 Fees.

Fees are established as follows:

(a) Fees for permit application:

...

(2) *Vehicle approval:*

(A) Inspection fee per motorized vehicle 50.00

(B) Re-inspection fee (required for missed bi-annual inspection) 25.00

(C) Application fee per non-motorized vehicle ~~50.00~~ \$25.00

Section 3. Amendment of Regulations. 20 CBJAC 40.580, relating to insurance, is amended to read:

20 CBJAC 40.580 Insurance.

(a) Commercial General Liability Insurance for Class A & Class B Vehicles. No certificate of public convenience and necessity shall be issued or continued in operation unless there is in full force and effect automobile insurance policies issued by one or more insurance companies licensed to do business in the state of Alaska and covering all motorized vehicles authorized under the certificate. The policy shall provide coverage for each motorized vehicle authorized in the amount of \$100,000.00 for bodily injury to any one person, in the amount of \$300,000.00 for injuries to more than one person which are sustained in the same accident, and \$50,000.00 for property damage resulting from any one accident. ~~Each policy shall name the City and Borough of Juneau as an additional insured. This insurance policy is to contain, or be endorsed to contain,~~ additional insured status for the CBJ, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers.

(b) Commercial General Liability Insurance for Class C Vehicles. The holder must maintain Commercial General Liability Insurance in an amount it deems reasonably sufficient to cover any suit that may be brought against the Operator. This amount must be at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence, and \$2,000,000 aggregate. This insurance policy is to contain, or be endorsed to contain, additional insured status for the CBJ, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers.

~~(b)~~(c) Each policy shall contain a clause that it may not be canceled or terminated or allowed to expire by insurer without 30 days' notice to the City and Borough. A certificate showing issuance of the policy and containing statements as to coverage and cancellation shall be filed annually with the administrator.

~~(e)~~(d) The administrator may allow the holder to file individual liability insurance policies for each vehicle registered to the certificate. If the owner of a vehicle registered to a certificate is not the holder, the owner may purchase the policy. It is the responsibility of the holder to have at all times on file with the administrator the individual certificates of insurance.

Summary:

This change will reduce the inspection cost for Class C vehicles and clearly defines insurance requirements for all classes of vehicles. No other changes to the CPV regulations will be considered at this time.
